Includes a feature to pay bills easily in multiple currencies.




APP #2 Airbnb

Adobe Lightroom

Adobe Lightroom is a free to use photo editor on mobile devices. It's great for editing on the go and if you save a few of your popular presets, photos can be changed in a single touch.

With easy to use slide controls, the app is perfect for beginners to play around with colour, effects and details. For more advanced users Lightroom includes a tone curve, colour mixes and premium features.

Top tip - Many of the Instagram influencers have free ready-made presets you can download.



Mapy.cz

My absolute favourite map app for hiking and exploring new areas. Maps can be downloaded for offline use and routes can be saved to include way markers.

What I love most about this app that sets it apart from others is the topography lines. Seeing the elevation gain or decline in a hike really helps with planning.

Mapy.cz allows you to see trails which may not be shown elsewhere on the internet and is a definitely helpful when in the wilderness.



Workaway

I'll let you in on a little secret - Workaway has been the way I've saved over \$5,000 on accommodation costs this trip.

In brief, Workaway connects you to hosts who are looking for volunteers to help with certain projects in exchange for food and accommodation.

Different hosts would like you to stay for varying periods of time, but it is worth looking at destinations you would like to travel to.

You must sign up to Workaway.info online and to contact hosts pay a \$42 USD membership fee.




Skyscanner

You can also use the app to book hotels and car hire at great prices.




Beanhunter
